THE STARLING HOTEL

Prepare to be impressed with every detail from bold design styles to sweeping views of the city skyline to pampering spa experiences. BARBIE BEACH

In Turin, GA is a beach with some unusual inhabitants. This six-by-four-foot plot of sand is where Barbies and Kens (some clothed, some not) lounge and play. The display changes regularly to reflect current events like the Olympics, a royal wedding, or the Fourth of July. TINY DOORS

The tour that everyone's talking about is smaller than one might expect. Karen Anderson Singer, the artist behind the ongoing project made up of seven-inch door sculptures has placed over 22 tiny doors throughout the city. Take a self-guided tour using a custom online map, each door a celebration of the specific neighborhood or area they are placed in. Some doors are even enabled through augmented reality to show visitors what lies inside of each gateway.






THE BOOTH MUSEUM

Experience the American West without leaving the Southeast. With over 120,000 square feet of display area, and as many as four rotating exhibits and permanent collections, this site will leave guests hollering "Yeehaw!" Upcoming exhibitions include contemporary American artists' metal sculptures. NEWNAN MERCANTILE

This area boasts numerous entries in the National Historic Registry along with outdoor experiences, arts and entertainment outlets and more.
